1. Regarding Appendix E – SECC Functional Requirements: May vendors expand the width of the comments column to fit the page as long-as there is no change to the content? May the margins be changed? (if not, the hole punch will go through the assigned header.)

2. Please verify the exact program name, vendor and address of the JMS software supplier currently in use at Scott County Sheriff's Office.

3. Will the agency please clarify what specific information is desired from vendors in RFP Section 7.2.7.c. *The company's strategic plan for the proposed products?*

*SECC is interested in the company's roadmap for the proposed products and how it plans to position itself strategically in the public safety information system marketplace.*

4. Regarding RFP Section 7.9.2 d. What percentage are you looking for? The percent of time that the personnel will be working on this project versus other projects? Or the percent of total time on this project?

*Please identify the percentage of employee's time working on the SECC project (e.g., total time for all personnel should add up to 100%).*

5. If the agency is going to invest in a new JMS, we would want to propose the most robust capabilities possible. There is no mention of barcode scanning of

the inmates (cell checks, movements, etc). Is this desired? May we propose this as an option?

*This functionality may be proposed as an option.*

6. Questions regarding Appendix E – SECC Functional Requirements, **MOBILE** tab:

- a. Item 13 – Please clarify what the Unit Call Sign is. Is that the CAD data element sent to the CAD Dispatch form?

*The Unit Call Sign is the radio call sign assigned to a first responder. It generally identifies the agency, shift, and area in which the first responder is working.*

- b. Item 39 – Which files / file types does SECC want to store on removable media?

*SECC would like to store any file that can be saved.*

- c. Item 103 – Please clarify what is meant by other MDC operational status.

*Any status information that can be provided about the MDC (e.g., busy, transmitting message, etc.).*

- d. Items 192 – Request is unclear. Please clarify the requirement.

*When a unit logs onto the MDC, its status is automatically updated in the CAD system so that units do not have to log on to both the MDC and the CAD systems.*

- e. Items 403 – 412 – Please clarify the message types that this functionality is required for.

*Messaging refers to messages sent between vehicles, from Dispatch to vehicles and from desktop computers to vehicles.*

7. Questions regarding Appendix E – SECC Functional Requirements, **RMS** tab:

- a. Regarding questions 6-20: Based on these requirements, the agency indicates that they are required to submit both NIBRS and UCR. Typically agencies are mandated to only submit either NIBRS or UCR data to the state and FBR. Please identify which protocol is required for this agency?

*SECC does NIBRS reporting. However, it would like the ability to submit UCR reports as well.*

- b. Item 421 – Incomplete requirement, please advise.

*Please revise requirement to read: "Ability to flag any master index record"*

- c. Item 759 - Can the agency identify what the *current* agency property system bar-coding specifications are?

*For items, the barcode is standard Code39, representing the log number, a hyphen, then the piece number/item number from that internal log number.*

*For example:*

*5000-1*

*5000-2*

*Etc.*

*The next version of Evidence Tracker software will allow the barcode type to be changed to Code128 or a 2D barcode.*

- d. Item 900 - Please provide a complete listing of all data elements required for the Iowa DOT collision reporting system.

- e. Items 912-913 - Does the agency currently have the hardware to capture both formats?

*Davenport and Scott County currently uses barcode scan format and does not have card swipe capabilities.*

*Bettendorf does not currently have either hardware solutions available in their vehicles.*

- f. Items 973-974 - Please provide the necessary data format and data elements required to autopopulate the NICB form and electronically send the NICB form to IOWA.

*New vendors must be tested and certified by the state before than can make any kind of submissions of transactions to the switch.*

*Iowa no longer participates in NICB impounds.*

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- g. Item 1003 - Please provide the available fields from the IOWA query returns that will be available and the format that these fields are provided in.

*SECC desires to populate reports with standard VIN or License Plate query returns.*

- h. Items 1466-1475 - Please identify the capabilities of IOWA/NCIC to Clear, Cancel and Update a warrant from an RMS system. Please provide the security parameters and data transfer format required to be IOWA/NCIC compliant for these transactions. A detailed document is desired.

*SECC is seeking to leverage the experience of the successful proposer to identify these issues as part of the interface and system implementation.*

- i. Item 2161 is “blacked out” and a response appears to be needed here.

*Please disregard the “grayed out” area and provide a response.*

- 8. Regarding Appendix E – SECC Functional Requirements, **INTERFACES** tab: In order to provide an accurate response, we the following information on the interfaces listed below (as numbered within Appendix E).
  - a. Information about the data file transfer format (i.e. XML, flat-file, SQL, etc.)
  - b. The number of fields of data required for each interface
  - c. The data flow for each interface (i.e. bi-directional, synchronous, asynchronous, etc.)

- d. Interface capabilities of 3<sup>rd</sup> party vendor
- e. Agency assumptions for the interface
- f. Contact information for 3<sup>rd</sup> party application
- g. Identify any costs that would be incurred by the 3<sup>rd</sup> party vendor for integration (i.e. such API development costs, interface application costs, etc.)
