Building Maintenance:

In checking claims in the course of this audit, it was noted that Commercial Cleaning and Sanitation, Inc., Rock Island, Illinois, received \$70,106.50 during this fiscal period for cleaning the Courthouse, Welfare Building and Courthouse Annex. In addition, Varsity Window Cleaning of Davenport received \$1,375.00 for window cleaning. Building and maintenance employees received \$41,784.59 in salaries, \$10,788.27 of which was for the night watchman, parking lot attendant and other help. The grand total for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1976, for janitorial services was \$113,266.09. This, in our opinion, seems to be rather large.

A breakdown of the Commercial Cleaning and Sanitation, Inc., bill for the three buildings serviced by them is as follows:

- (1) Scott County Courthouse, with approximately 62,716 square feet, the charge for cleaning services for the period ended June 30, 1976, was \$ 48,633.50
- (2) Scott County Courthouse Annex, with approximately 2,268 square feet, the charge was 8,970,00
- (3) Scott County Social Services Office, with approximately 9,000 square feet, the charge was 11,960.00

Building Maintenance (continued):

It is also noted that the cleaning contract-agreement in Scott County is with an out-of-State firm. It is recommended that, wherever possible, local firms should be employed. We note that this firm now has offices in Davenport.

In reviewing the Request for Proposals (Instructions to Bidders), it appears that the bids have not been updated since the original bids in 1972. For expenditures of this magnitude, the State Auditor's office believes that if outside firms were to continue providing these services, competitive bids should be submitted at least biannually for the Board of Supervisors to review.

*It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors review these services and possibly consider hiring their own personnel on an annual basis which, we believe, could be a considerable savings to the taxpayers of Scott County.

*The Board minutes of May 20, 1977, indicate that the Board of Supervisors are in the process of reviewing the Cleaning Contract.

Reimbursable Meals:

It was also noted in the auditing of claims that whenever a claim was made for reimbursement of meals, \$4.00 was the amount allowed in most cases. The Board minutes of August 1, 1974, indicates that a resolution was made relative to allowable expenses on claims incurred for County business. Section 4 of this resolution states: "Meals shall be reimbursed in the amount actually expended, but not to exceed \$4.00 for any one meal."

The State Auditor's office does not believe that it was the intent of the Board for every meal to be \$4.00. The Board of Supervisors should review this policy agreement and, perhaps, update the resolution, clarifying their intent and indicating a maximum allowance.

This item was discussed with the County Coordinator, and he agreed to present it to the Board for their consideration.

General Comments:

The State Auditor's office recommends a review of Public Vehicles used as shown in Exhibit A.

All three-year salary and expense comparisons are listed in compliance with Chapters 11.6 and 11.11.

Attention is directed to Schedule 3-A for three-year comparison of cost of General Fund.

An audit was made to see that each individual resident's account has been properly accounted for in the County Care Facility.

The State Auditor's office and Field Auditors did assist any and all offices that have asked for assistance. The State Auditor's office wishes to assist in any way possible.

It is recommended that the uniform sick leave policy be established by the Board of Supervisors in cooperation with all elected Officials and records be kept for audit purposes in the next audit.

The Auditor of State wishes to thank the County Officials and Employees for their fine cooperation during this audit.

COMMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Budget:

On the Budget Report (Expenditure Record) most funds have a classified breakdown of expenditures. It is recommended that a classified breakdown be implemented in all funds. Extra audit time was spent by the Field Auditor, in going through the Warrant Register to classify the expenditures in the funds in which there was only a total of warrants issued.

It was noted the County Auditor's office did not file a quarterly report of fees collected for each quarter. The County Auditor's office has been notified that it is required to file a report of fees collected each quarter to the Board of Supervisors, and a check for the fees made payable to the County Treasurer.

When claims are presented for payment, the County Auditor should preaudit the claim before presenting it to the Board for approval. Care should be exercised to see that in claims for lodging, the hotel or motel receipt should be attached, and in claims for mileage, the destination and number of miles driven should be shown. Also, if mileage is paid, there should be no reimbursement for parking. The State Auditor's office believes that Section 79.13 applies to all mileage claims, as well as to the Sheriff's Department.

General Comments:

Audit time is spent in checking all warrant accounts, verification of certain charges, claims allowed and paid, and proper accounting of money received by County Auditor.

COMMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

It was noted that each of the Sheriff's claims for mileage showed only "X" miles times 15 cents per mile with no indication of destination as required by Section 79.13 of the Iowa Code. The matter was discussed with the Sheriff, and he stated that he had backup papers to verify the mileage of each of the cliams. Copies of these backup papers for each claim were made available to the Field Auditor.

It was recommended to the Sheriff that all future claims show date, destination, and the number of miles driven. The Sheriff concurred with the recommendation and stated that in the future all claims will contain this information.

Section 79.13. Particulars required.

"The board of supervisors shall not approve any claim for mileage or other traveling expenses presented by any peace officer including the sheriff and his deputies unless the destinations, and number of miles covered in each trip are given, or, in the case of extended trips, unless railroad, hotel, and other traveling expenses, except meals, are verified by receipts."

A copy of this audit is being forwarded to Attorney General for whatever purpose it may serve.

General Comments:

In addition to the audit of each transaction, the examination included a comparative review of expenditures for any excess expense for service received.

COMMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The examination of records of the Clerk of Court and Associate Court offices required an extra amount of time. The receipt side of the cashbook does not always show where the money was disbursed, and the disbursement side does not always show where the money was received, therefore, each transaction had to be traced through the cashbook, trust account book and checkbook. Also, the trust book does not show all trusts.

It is recommended that the bookkeepers keep books only, and all other duties assigned to them be reassigned to other persons in the office.

Receipts for partial payments of costs should be disbursed from the trust account and distributed to the case involved. Some of these accounts are over twenty (20) years old and the balance of cost will, in most cases, never be paid.

The above items were reviewed with the Clerk of Court, and he indicated that further consideration would be given to changing the system wherever possible.

The Auditor of State's office recommends that, effective immediately, accounts should be balanced monthly, listing outstanding checks, as well as trusts on hand.

General Comments:

Our examination of receipts and disbursements was made in compliance with generally accepted auditing standards and, accordingly, included such tests of the accounting records and substantiation of findings as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

Item 1 - Resident Accounts:

- 1. The Field Auditor noted that the bookkeeper at the County Care Facility is still handling the resident accounts on file cards and keeping the resident's money in separate envelopes. Since there was no reconciliation of the accounts at the close of the fiscal year, it was necessary to extend the examination of resident accounts to May 9, 1977.
- 2. The State Auditor's office has previously recommended that a ledger be set up with a separate sheet for each resident, and a control sheet for the account. It was further recommended that a checking account be maintained in a bank, and a petty cash box kept in the office to handle the routine deposits and withdrawals. Where practical, a savings account should be opened when a resident's account reaches approximately \$200.00.

These items were discussed with the administrator and bookkeeper, and recommendations were complied with on May 10, 1977.

Item 2 - County Care Facility Canteen Fund:

- 1. An audit of the claims in the County Mental Health and Institutions Fund reveals that a total of 2,010 cases of pop (48,240 bottles) were purchased for the Pine Knoll Health Care Facility during the fiscal year at a cost of \$5,596.40.
- 2. A total of 542 cartons of cigarettes (5,420 packs) were purchased at a cost of \$2,134.44.

- 3. Also, a total of 95 boxes of candy and 16 cartons of chewing gum were purchased at a cost of \$392.70.

- 5. The average cost paid for a bottle of pop is 12 cents. It is dispensed in a vending machine for 10 cents (a loss of two cents per bottle). The average cost paid for a pack of cigarettes is 39 cents. They are sold for 45 cents in the machine. This does not take into account any bottle breakage or loss which would further increase the costs to the County.
- 6. Resident capacity at the County Care Facility is 70; the average number of residents during the year was 47.
- 7. Residents occupy the second and third floors of the County Care Facility, with the third floor confined to an average of 15 residents who need special care and treatment. These residents are given incentive tokens for good behavior and voluntarily assuming responsibility for their own personal hygiene. In turn,

these tokens can be used to purchase "free" canteen items.

- 8. Residents who are qualified work at odd jobs in the County Care Facility and are paid a nominal wage from the Canteen Fund. A total of \$3,996.90 was paid out for wages during the fiscal year. In addition, \$149.50 in "free items" was given to residents who had no money to purchase them.
- 9. Approximately \$2,000.00 remains unaccounted for between the purchase of canteen items (\$8,123.54) and reimbursements (\$6,107.04). It is our opinion that the free token program outlined in Item 7 above would account for this amount.

Appropriate recommendations were made for good bookkeeping and leaving audit trails, and the County Care Facility informed the Field Auditor they would comply.

In checking the City Assessor's claims, it was noted that claims for mileage were not itemized. The State Auditor's office believes that Code Section 79.13 applies to all County Officers, as well as to the County Sheriff and his deputies. The Code Section states, in part:

"The Board of Supervisors shall not approve any claim for mileage or other traveling expenses presented by any peace officer, including the Sheriff and his deputies, unless the destinations and number of miles covered in each trip are given."

It was recommended to the City Assessor that future mileage claims designate the destination or purpose of trip along with miles covered.

Chapter 11, Section 11.11 SCOPE OF EXAMINATIONS

"All examinations shall be made without notice to the office examined. On every examination inquiry shall be made as to the financial condition and resources of the county, school or city; whether the cost price for improvements and material in said county, school or city is in excess of the cost price for like things in other counties, schools or cities of the state; whether the county, school, or city authorities are complying with the law; and whether the accounts and reports are being accurately kept."

Chapter 11, Section 11.14 REPORTS---PUBLIC INSPECTION

". . .All reports shall be open to public inspection, including copies on file in the office of the state auditor, and refusal on the part of any public official to permit such inspection when such reports have been filed with him shall constitute a misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed fifty dollars or by imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed fifteen days.

In addition to the foregoing, notice that the report has been filed shall be forwarded immediately to each newspaper, radio station or television station located in the county, municipality or school district which is under investigation or audit; except that if there is no newspaper, radio station or television station located therein, such notice shall be sent to the official newspapers of the county."
