Supervisor Maxwell spoke on Bettendorf Intergovernmental where they reviewed the declining number of students. He attended a Planning and Zoning meeting; there were many questions regarding the power plant being built in the Maysville area. He also reviewed the Governor's concerns on rural Fire Department's; a study is being performed throughout the state and will conclude after the next session.
