- 2. To conduct a preliminary investigation of the cause and manner of death, prepare a written report of the findings, and submit report to state medical examiner and county attorney if a person's death affects the public interest.
- 4. To conduct investigation and determine whether the public interest requires an autopsy or other special investigation.
- 5. To notify the county attorney to apply for a court order to exhume the body in a case of a sudden, violent or suspicious death after which the body is buried without an investigation or autopsy.
