Homeland Security/EMA/IMT Report

Discussion:

Ross Bergen announced that there will be crude oil tankers moving through the Quad City area from South Dakota. He was asked to provide advanced warning to the LEPC due to the possible dangers of a spill. Ross did specify that the tankers will only affect the Illinois side of the river at this time. He announced that June 4th is the hostile action-based exercise in Illinois, June 5th will be the annual EOC training at SECC at 9 a.m. and the annual Maritime Meeting will be held on June 22nd at 10 a.m.

2014 Exercise Report

Discussion:

Gerry Voelliger from Bettendorf Fire discussed the Arsenal's May 14th multi-scene tornado disaster fullexercise held locally with MABAS. He stated that the group tested credentialing, mass casualty response, hazardous materials response, and high-tech rescue operations. It was an eight hour exercise that involved over 200 rescuers on-site, and included the hazmat team from Galesburg, as well as the hightech rescue team from Peoria. The IMT team was deployed. Denny and Bart Howard worked together to develop the incident action plan and help fill ICS positions.
