Call to Order-Introductions

Discussion:

Minutes of the January 25th meeting

Discussion:

Steve Knorrek motioned to approve the QCEPC January 25, 2019 meeting minutes and Paul Sikorski seconded, the motion passed.

Homeland Security/EMA/IMT Reports

Discussion:

Brian Wright shared he is working with SSAB to facilitate an ICS100 course, tabletop and eventually drill.

Chance Kness reminded the group of the Train the Trainor Shooting Simulator training on March 14, 2019 and CERT training March 22, 2019 thru March 24, 2019.

Scott Starns shared the Arsenal FY'19 Exercise this year will be an internal event.

Brian Payne reported the Quad City Weather EOC has an initiation goal date of April 1, 2019. The American Medical Response EMS team will meet with the IMT and PIO groups on April 1st to talk about the Vegas shooting. Lastly, Brian explained the Quad City Area Nursing Facilities coalition met. Attendees had the opportunity to discuss the exercise and planning efforts occurring during the year to meet CMS requirements. The preparedness coalition is trying to get as many of the CMS facilities involved in this process and to utilize the resources available. The group will be meeting quarterly with a goal of meeting annually in the future.

Healthcare Coalition Updates

Discussion:

Denny Coon reported Area 5A Salamander Training has been rescheduled to May 7, 2019 at the Scott County EOC. Chris Varnes and Brian Payne participated in a POD tabletop in Tipton.

Al Loeffelholz reported he will be leading the Regional Healthcare Collation Surge test the first part of March. Al shared Region II in Illinois will be holding a multi-hospital full-scale exercise in late April.

QCLEPC: Training, Planning, Exercise

Discussion:

Dave Donovan reported Tier II reports are due March 1, 2019. After the reports are returned, they will be working with Scott County GIS to map the hazards in comparison to special facilities. Dave shared the DECON trailer that was formally housed at Genesis is now housed at Scott County EMA.

Communication Center Updates

Discussion:

Dave Donovan gave a radio project update. The project is in the negotiation phase and is currently looking as if it will be June 2019 before a contract is signed. A project management team has been formed consisting of Steve Siever, Darren Hart, Tracey Sanders and Dave Donovan. Dave reminded the group of the 911-phone upgrade February 27, 2019. This is the final piece in order for SECC to begin accepting text messages. Rock Island County is ready to go. There will be a Quad City area wide public education thereafter. Lastly, Dave reported the 2018.4 upgrade for NWS is scheduled for April 1, 2019.

Discussion:

Denny Coon reported the Scott County Health Department is planning a jail tabletop exercise with a Norovirus scenario in the jail setting.

EMS Reports – QCA Opioid Crisis

Discussion:

Kevin Lange shared the Chapter 132 re-write recorded webinar and slides are posted on the IDPH website. Kevin reported they continue to do Hands Only CPR classes and have had over 290 people complete the Stop the Bleed training since the first of the year.

Adam Haut shared Kurtz Ambulance is now servicing Coal Valley.

Adam reported CADS has received a grant and is working with a multi-agency group monthly discussing illegal and prescription opioid abuse in children between the ages of 12 -25 years old and how to get training and education in the schools.

Fire Service Reports

Discussion:

Denny Coon reported Kyle Priest is gathering information on data collection systems being used by all EMS providers in Scott County. This information will aid in determining a solution to interface data from the SECC CADS system into the Image Trend System.

Law Enforcement/TSA/Intel Reports

I-74 Bridge Replacement Updates

Discussion:

Jeff Koenig gave a presentation/update on the I-74 Bridge Replacement Project. In March, weather permitting, construction will require that all Iowa-bound (westbound) interstate through-traffic be detoured to I-80 and I-280. The I-74 river crossing will remain open throughout construction; however, the Iowa-bound bridge will be reduced to one lane. Local traffic traveling to downtown Moline and Bettendorf will be routed around certain section of I-74 via local roads.

Beginning March 18, weather permitting:

- Local traffic heading to downtown Moline must use 19th Street
- Local traffic heading to Bettendorf must use the Iowa-bound I-74 on-ramp at River Drive
- All on- and off-ramps will remain open on Illinois-bound (eastbound) I-74 during the 2019 construction season

Beginning March 25, weather permitting:

- The Iowa-bound I-74 bridge will be reduced to one lane
- Local traffic on the Iowa-bound bridge must take Exit 4 to Grant Street/U.S. 67 in Bettendorf
- **Through May 2019 only:** Local traffic in Bettendorf will be routed from Grant Street/U.S. 67 to 14th Street to Kimberly Road to Middle Road to access westbound I-74

Beginning in June, weather permitting, the local traffic route in Bettendorf will change to the following:

• Local traffic on the Iowa-bound bridge must take Exit 4 to Grant Street/U.S. 67 in Bettendorf and use the existing on-ramp at 14th Street to access westbound I-74

The departments of transportation anticipate that new Iowa-bound bridge will open to traffic in the first half of 2020. However, this schedule is dependent on multiple factors.
