# Vaccine one of our pandemic-fighting tools

Remarks from Nita Ludwig, administrator, Rock Island County Health Department

We are grateful for the excitement and interest that is building about the COVID-19 vaccine as doses continue to be given in our community. While the supply is currently very limited, we know that more will continue to make its way into our community each week, giving us the opportunity to ensure more and more of our healthcare workers are protected. We hope there will be this much excitement as we all get our turn to get vaccinated.

This vaccine is giving us a light at the end of the tunnel. However, the vaccine cannot do this alone. It is one of the tools we have in our pandemic-fighting toolbox. The COVID-19 vaccine will work in conjunction with the wearing of masks, social distancing, and handwashing as critical to slowing the pandemic.

It is important for our community to understand that once someone begins to build immunity from the virus after they have received two doses of the vaccine does not mean that will immediately be able to run around mask-free and throw caution to the wind. It will take having large numbers of individuals vaccinated before we can even begin having conversations about getting to relax on social distancing and the wearing of masks. For now, whether you get the vaccine in the upcoming days or not, you will still need to mask, social distance, wash your hands, and stay home when sick. You know...the usual...the things you have been hearing on repeat for nearly a year. We do not say this to trample on the excitement the vaccine brings.

However, we want to make sure our community understands that the vaccine is just one tool that will get us where we need to go.
