April is Medicaid Awareness Month. Iowa Medicaid provides health coverage to over 700.000 lowans every year, including eligible low-income adults, children, pregnant women, older adults and people with disabilities.

Medicaid and the Healthy And Well Kids in Iowa (Hawki) program can help provide access to important medical care, such as routine check-ups, mental health services, dentist visits, immunizations, and more-keeping children and teens healthy.
