# **School Dental Screenings**

The beginning of a new school year is right around the corner. What a great time to make sure your family's dental health is the best it can be! Visiting the dentist is an important part of preparing for school. Regular check-ups can avoid painful toothaches and reduce the amount of time children miss from school.

### Iowa's School Dental Screening Requirement

The state of Iowa recognizes the importance of regular dental care in children's health, and has mandated that dental screenings be



required for school enrollment. The dental screenings will help to detect dental problems and will teach children the importance of oral health. Detecting dental problems early can reduce costs for parents and will improve the child's health.

Parents of children entering kindergarten, 9th grade, and transfer students must show that their children have received a dental screening. A special form will be filled out by your provider and must be turned into the school. Dental screening forms can be picked up at your child's school or by downloading from the <u>Scott County Health Department I-</u> <u>Smile™ Dental Screening Web page</u>.

Dental screenings can be provided by a variety of health care workers. For students entering kindergarten, a dental screening performed by a dentist, dental hygienist, physician, physician assistant, or nurse is acceptable. For those students entering ninth grade, a dental screening by a dentist or dental hygienist is required.

#### A Dental Home is Best!

Required dental screenings are a great step to improve dental health for school aged children. However, regular dental care, from a dental home, is best for assuring healthy teeth and gums for the long term. Dental care must start early as baby teeth begin to appear around age six months and are important for holding space in the jaws for the growing adult teeth. As a rule of thumb, children should start seeing a dentist by their first birthday. Regular check-ups by a dentist provides complete care that can include prevention, education, treatment, and emergency services. The dentist checks for any problem and helps parents learn how to care for teeth and correct unhealthy habits. Having a dentist that your child

regularly sees for these services means your child has a dental home! Everyone in your family should have a dental home even you!


