

April is STD Awareness Month, an annual observance to raise public awareness about the impact of sexually transmitted diseases on the lives of Americans and the importance of individuals discussing sexual health with their health care providers and with their partners.

STDs are a major public health issue in the United States. The Center for Disease Control and Prevention estimates that there are approximately 20 million new cases of STDs in the U.S. each year, almost half of them among young people ages 15 to 24.

Many of those who are infected don't know it. Many STDs do not have any symptoms. If you are sexually active, the only way to know for sure whether you have a STD is to get tested. STDs are preventable and treatable. Join with others this month and help raise awareness on the importance of Getting Yourself Tested!


