World AIDS Day, held each year on December 1st, is an opportunity for people worldwide to unite in the fight against HIV, show their support for people living with the virus, and remember those we have lost. Incredible advances in HIV prevention and treatment have come in recent years: a daily medication that offers protection from HIV infection, more effective treatments for HIV that are easier to take, and studies that have revealed that with successful treatment, people living with HIV can achieve an undetectable viral load and effectively pose no risk of transmitting HIV to others. We do not yet have a cure for HIV, but we can all work to eliminate the social stigma around HIV, educate and encourage people to be tested; and know their HIV status without the fear that has driven this epidemic for decades. A generation free from HIV is truly within sight!
