Playground Safety

Children love to spend time outdoors and playgrounds provide community spaces for families and friends to play and learn together. Active outdoor play supports a child's physical, social, emotional, and intellectual growth. Unfortunately, playgrounds can also lead to injuries, with more than 200,000 US children requiring medical treatment from playground injuries each year. To prevent playground injuries and encourage safe behavior, the National Program for Playground Safety (NPPS) has developed the S.A.F.E.™ Framework for playground safety:

- **S** = Supervision: Children need adult supervisors who are alert, aware of risks, and ready to respond to unsafe play.
- A = Appropriate Environments: Children should play on equipment that fits their size and abilities.
- F = Fall Surfacing: Playground equipment needs safe surfacing under and around it to protect children from fall related injuries.
- **E** = Equipment Maintenance: Routine maintenance of playground equipment and spaces reduces the risk of injury and will prolong the life of the playground.

The components of this research-based model work together to create and maintain safe play spaces for children. Everyone from visitors to maintenance staff can help keep spaces safe for children. Use NPPS's Playground Report Card to score your outdoor play space and work to make improvements.
