Partner Spotlight:

Waste Commission of Scott County

The Waste Commission of Scott County started in 1972 and works closely with the Scott County Health Department. The Waste Commission operates facilities such as the Scott Area Landfill, the Scott Area Recycling Center, the Household Hazardous Material Facility, and the Electronics Recovery Center. The landfill, located in Buffalo, just added a new cell to their landfill as they are close to reaching capacity in their current cell. The Electronics Recovery Center is the first of its kind in Iowa. They will take old televisions, computers, monitors, cell phones, among other electronics. One new program the Waste Commission began in 2024 is a drop-off box for recycling household batteries such as those from power tools, electronics, or musical greeting cards. This drop box is located at the Scott Area Recycling Center which is located at 5640 Carey Avenue in Davenport.
