

Vander Veer Has an Illustrious Past!

Are we in for a treat! Our February meeting will be at the conservatory at Vander Veer Botanical Park, with new member Anne Hailey leading the meeting. We'll be out of the cold in the conservatory where we can admire the plants and think of spring. Learn about the history of this public park which has been operated by the City of Davenport since 1885! The park was named Central Park after the Famous New York Park. At one time county fairs and concerts were held there. In the days before the automobile it was a popular and fashionable gathering place, a spot where the horse and carriages could cruise the scenic pathways.

Since 1991 The Friends of Vander Veer and the City of Davenport have made many additions and more are in the planning stage. Much of Vander Veer's history can be seen through lithograph postcards both in Vander Veer's collection and Karen Anderson's collection. Don't miss this!

Have you driven down River Drive lately and noticed all the activity surrounding a historic Gothic Revival house located between Mississippi Ave and Esplanade? The house was a 3 plex and now, thanks to Bob Yapp, is being returned to its former glory. The house was hidden, but the hedge has been cut down. The aluminum siding has been torn off and the fire escapes removed to reveal the framework of a fashionable Gothic house which was pictured in the Village of East Davenport Revitalization Study Book.

The house was built in 1869 by William Foster. In 1886 the owner was Morris Richardson, the son of the owner of Der Demokrat. Bob is building a reproduction 3 car garage as part of the project.
