Davenport Historic Preservation Commission Meetings can be seen on CH. 18? The commission meets at 5:00 PM on the Tuesday between regular council meetings. The last meeting was held April 8. Jennifer Nahra, who tapes council and commission meetings for the City of Davenport, ran the tape of the meeting 4 times on both April 9 and April 10. She can't predict exactly when the meetings will be shown because of the unpredictability of the length of commission meetings. However, for those of you who are interested, this is an opportunity to view the workings of the commission. Six of the nine members of the commission are SCHPS members and SCHPS worked very actively in 1991 for the formation of the commission.

April Meeting Overview

Really, an hour and a half is hardly enough at the B.J. Palmer House. You get an idea of how the Palmers lived and are bowled over by the immensity and diversity of his collections. Our student guides were very well versed in the history of the mansion, Palmer's contributions to Chiropractic, his pioneering in broadcasting and his contributions to the city of Davenport. Visitors to historic site have a new way to plan trips. The National Register of Historic Places just launched a database that can be accessed for free through its Website (www.cr.nps.gov/nr). The site if divided into four sections: research, travel. education and publications. Visitors can search the database by name, subject or geographic location. Trip planning tools include "Discover Our Shared Heritage": travel itineraries that spotlight different communities and themes across the country. Each itinerary includes tourist information for each site, interactive maps, vintage and color photographs and links to related tourism Web sites.
