


A lively question and answer period followed. We also had an opportunity to see progress on the LeClaire House. And we got out just before the downpour started. SCHPS luck???

Schuetzen Park Opportunity

Since 1870, Schuetzen Park has been an important part or our community. To ensure that future generations can enjoy the same natural beauty beloved by us and our forbearers, the Schuetzen Park forest must be preserved.

The centerpiece of this preservation project is the acquisition of 7.5 acres of forest land adjacent to the Schuetzen Park Historic Site. The goal to purchase this sensitive woodland is 70% met. Thanks to a recent grant by the Riverboat Development Authority, we are one step closer to acquiring this property. This grant will add 50% to any new donation, however, we can only collect this new grant money if you help. For example, if you assist with a \$100.00 gift, the grant will give another \$50.00 and so on.
