Visit Two Wonderful Georgian/Federal Revival Homes in the Oak Lane District!

The homes are located at 720 and 726 East Locust St and are part of the Oak Lane Historic District. The Oak Lane District was built in the early 1900's as Cutter's Oak Lane addition and developed with typical turn-of-the-century frame dwellings. Around the corner are three large houses in the Georgian/Federal Revival style. We meet first at 720 E. Locust and see the entry hall. This house, now a 4 plex, has been lovingly maintained by Katie and Bob Sieren. They have taken great pride in this lovely home. Next we'll go to the home of our new members, Nora and Joseph Riley at 726 E. Locust St. They have recently moved to their home and are currently working to restore it to a one family home after years of being used as a duplex.
