We'll gather outside the theater at 6:30 P.M. to admire the outside of the building, particularly the carvings. Then we'll go inside for a real treat! Mick Elliott is a local history researcher who has extensively studied the history of the Kahl Building and the Capital Theater.

He has developed a slide show which he personally narrates like a 1940's radio announcer. Our picture below shows the first marquee of the theater as it looked in the 1920's. At this time the Tri-City Symphony was performing here. In the 1920s neon lighting was invented and the present marquee installed. His presentation lasts about an hour. ## River Action Publication Excerpt

The publication of River Action, organizer of the Sept. 14-17 Riverway event in which SCHPS participated, has posted very impressive statistics—1.5 million people in 4 states were notified about the event. 2300 tickets were sold for the steam railroad tour and 894 tickets for the Celebration Ball. There were 95 racers at Sylvan Island. Our very own Karen Anderson was one of 16 story tellers at different locations who entertained receptive audiences!
