Christmas Tour Could be Last for RIA Quarters One

Quarters One, the Rock Island Arsenal's 134-year-old, 20,000 square-foot Italiante-style mansion, is elegantly dressed for the holidays. Home to Major General Jerome Johnson and his wife, Doris, Quarters One is the nation's second-biggest federally owned single-family residence, trailing only the White House.

It opened in 1871 and features 51 rooms, 10 fireplaces and a four-story observation tower complete with rooftop deck. The home was the brainchild of General Thomas Jefferson Rodman, though Rodman died just months before the mansion officially began serving the Rock Island Arsenal.

On Saturday, 12/9 from noon to 6 p.m., the Rock Island Arsenal Women's Club will host a holiday home tour of Quarters One, taking the private residence to the community for what could be the last time. The \$20 entrance fee proceeds will go to the group's general scholarship fund.

Mrs. Johnson says she knows nothing about her home's fate, but agreed it could be the final holiday tour—as a private residence—for Quarters One. The Army's Installation Management Agency decided the limestone mansion, which has served 37 military commanders and their families, would be best used as a possible revenue-generating facility.

The hope of RIAGC, according to a news release, is "To convert and transform Quarters One into a historically compliant adaptive re-use in order to optimize return."
