# Follow the Celtic Heritage Trail~

Long before the 1848 Revolution sent tens of thousands of German immigrants fleeing to the Midwest in search of political freedom, wagon trains of disenfranchised Irish immigrants had already broken the trail across half a continent and into the Black Hawk Purchase by 1833. By the time the city of Davenport was founded, in 1836, over twenty-five percent of the city's settlers were of Irish Catholic extraction.

Irish labor built the first railroads west of the Mississippi River, provided the muscle-inthe-arm to man the first log rafting mills, formed a tenacious fighting force during the Civil War, and became the backbone of the burgeoning "Farm Implement Capital of the World".

The compelling story of the contributions of laborers, merchants and publishers has become the focus of a fascinating new booklet, "The Early Celtic Heritage of Davenport", published by The Celtic Heritage Trail group, with the help of a \$23,000 RDA grant. The booklet features a tour map, photos and background information on the 10 new historic iron marker plaques, mounted on posts, which are being/have been erected throughout frontier Davenport. It is a booklet you will want to add to your history library collection!

Join SCHPS on Thursday, Sept. 11th, 6:00 P.M., in the parking lot behind Sacred Heart Cathedral for a fascinating guided car-caravan tour of Davenport's earliest Irish frontier history sites. Two Celtic Trail organizers, Bill Fisher, President of Celtic Heritage Trail, and Ryan Dye VP of CHT/Professor at St. Ambrose, will lead the tour. After the tour, our entourage will retire to Mac's Tavern, a proper Irish pub, on the north side of 3rd Street between Ripley and Harrison, for refreshments--and to raise a toast to celebrate Davenport's new Celtic Heritage Trail. (If you have a large vehicle that can carry several people and are willing to be a driver on the tour, please bring your large vehicle and offer other members the opportunity to ride with you on the tour). Cork Hill, the Irish neighborhood of old, is very steep and the area would be very difficult to traverse as a walking tour.) See you at 6:00, Sept. 11 for a Celtic Heritage Tour!
