

History of Davenport Schools and Old Davenport School Buildings~

Schools are an anchor of every community! They keep it alive and vibrant, and often determine where newcomers to an area will reside. Come and learn about the History of the Davenport Public Schools. The program, presented by Jim Schebler, will consist of a slide show of digitalized pictures and digitalized lantern slides of buildings and activities in the Davenport schools from the late 1800's and early 1900's. The digitalized slide show was prepared by Jim and Maureen Schebler, and will be presented with notes prepared by Bob McCue, the Davenport School Museum Board President. An introductory video about the Davenport School Museum will also be shown.

The program will be held at the Davenport School District's Central Administrative Building, the old Brenton Bank Building, located on corner of Brady St. and E. 16th St. (just south of Aldi's and directly across the street from where Kirkwood Blvd. T's into Brady St.). ONLY THE WEST (Main St.) ENTRANCE WILL BE UNLOCKED, so to enter the building, use the west, (Main Street side); inside the building take the elevator to the basement level. As you exit the elevator on the basement level, the Museum and our meeting site is to your left Punch and cookies, provided by SCHPS, will be served after the presentation.



Lantern slide of Polk Elementary School - built in 1878 at what is today the northwest corner of 8th and Marquette Streets. The slide was taken ca. 1924; Davenport Schools used the building until 1940. The site today is now the site of Zion Lutheran Church.

The buildings are used today much as they were when the Annie Wittenmyer orphans were housed there. Examples of this are the Annie Wittenmyer School built in 1913 that is still being used as a school for some of the children who now live at the complex. Another example is the cafeteria located in the administration building. Mr. Ossowski showed us through the brick Tudor Revival cottage and explained the renovations that were done.

There are presently 110 children living on the campus ranging in age from 5-18. Mr. Ossowski told the group about all of the services that are provided for the children who are cared for in this historical setting.

Also interesting was the Indian Burial Mound on the site that dates back to 500 B.C. The evening ended with the members sampling delicious cookies baked by some of the students who reside at this special place. Thanks to Rod, his staff, and the students for a very enjoyable and informative evening! The cookies were delicious!
