## The Battle of Credit Island and details on the Mississippi River at that time~

The Battle of Credit Island took place in September 1814. Twenty-nine year old Zachary Taylor (later U. S. President) was ordered to head north from St. Louis to avenge the attack by Chief Black Hawk on the Lt. Campbell supply party, which had tried to go from St. Louis to a fort in Prairie Du Chein, Wisconsin. Taylor's troops landed on Pelican Island, forcing the Sauk Indians downstream to Credit Island, near to what is now Davenport. Taylor's notes referred to being surprised to be fighting "a British artillery battalion, well-entrenched behind earthen redoubts".

Our speaker, Jack Tumbleson of Rock Island, has been studying the river's history

for decades. After reading Taylor's report in the archives of the Missouri Gazette newspaper, Tumbleson decided he had nothing to lose by calling the British Consulate in Chicago. When he asked if they had any notes from the Battle of Credit Island, he was told, "of course".

According to these battle reports, Taylor used keelboats

from which to shell the Indians. He warned his men to stay inside the boats, under cover. One of them, however, didn't listen, went out for a smoke, and was promptly shot by a Sauk. Tumbleson speculated it was the first incidence of smoking being hazardous to your health!
