# The Life and Writings of Local Davenport Author Susan Glaspell~

Susan was born July 1, 1876 in Davenport, Iowa, and she described her parents as "middle class, not very well to do." She attended public schools in Davenport, a graduate of Central, and earned a bachelor's degree from Drake University. She later did her graduate studies in English at the University of Chicago. The day after graduating, Susan joined the staff of the Des Moines Daily News as a political reporter and soon had her own column, "The News Girl."

Two years later, she moved back to Davenport to pursue her childhood ambition to be a fiction writer. Between, 1909 and 1912, she published three novels, including Fidelity, her most acclaimed novel.

In 1913 Susan married George "Jig" Cram Cook, moved with him to Greenwich Village and they had a summer residence in Provincetown, at the tip of Cape Cod. There in a small wooden building on the end of a pier, they established the Provincetown Players. Under pressure from her domineering husband - Cook, Susan wrote several plays and came into contact with struggling artists like Eugene O'Neill, who later became critically acclaimed. Susan left Davenport with Cook for the artistic and social freedom heralded in New York's Greenwich Village. Yet Glaspell's Midwestern roots shone through in much of her writing.

Susan died in 1948. On her deathbed she sought anonymity and destroyed notes, letters, and diaries, which were documentation to her talents and incredible career. Over the last half-century, graduate students have pieced her life together in their scholarly dissertations. Although she is little known, she is perhaps, although unheralded, one of America's greatest playwrights and novelists! Don't miss this chance to learn about one of our own: born and raised in Davenport, Iowa - Susan Glaspell-novelist, playwright, Pulitzer Prize Winner! – Little- known, un-acclaimed but yet GREAT-writer!

## Summary of February Meeting~

Thank you Jack Tumbleson, of the Coast Guard Auxiliary, for a most informative presentation on the History of the Upper Mississippi River valley including the Quad Cities. After skipping the first three million years of history, Tumbleson brought back to life the history of occupation and colonization by the French and Spanish and the resulting battles with the Indians who were already settled in the area. First came Marquette and Joliet in 1673 followed by Cavelier in 1679. By 1762 the territory east of the Mississippi was considered French, while the area west of the Mississippi belonged to Spain. Add in Revolutionary War history and the emergence of American troops, and Jack's talk was fascinating right down to the Battle of Credit Island in 1814 when Brevet General Zachary Taylor, who later became the 12th President of the United States, lined up keelboats in order to fire on the Sauk Indians. Taylor reported being met with a British Artillery Battalion well entrenched behind earthen redoubts. After reviewing records from the British Embassy in Chicago, Tumbleson learned that what Taylor was up against was Sgt. James Keating, with only one three-pound cannon located on a slight elevation without cover!
