Dr. Mary Ahlgren, museum director, had arranged to open the museum for our group beyond its normal hours to accommodate our tour. The museum is packed with an eclectic mix of items ranging from copies of Buffalo Bill's letters during his travels, to a Commission Document signed by Abraham Lincoln, to a large wasp nest. Docent Mary Stoddard's personal history with LeClaire was an asset. Bob Schiffke not only gives tours of the Lone Star, but he also works on restoring it. His knowledge of the boat and its history is impressive. All in all, it was an enjoyable and informative evening. A Must See for all Preservationists ~ A multi-media art exhibit in St. Ambrose University's Galvin Fine Arts Center Lobby (open 8 A.M.-9:00 P.M. daily through May 10th), presented by Todd McGreevy, Publisher of the River Cities Reader. McGreevy's "1914 River Installation" exhibit features 4 stunning 10 ft. wide photographic blow-ups of an historic 58-inch long panoramic photo taken on the Davenport riverfront in 1914. The blowups include stunning views of the Gold Coast hillside, hundreds of downtown buildings and steamboats docked on the brick levee. The ten foot wide, five foot tall, blowups are the next best thing to stepping back into a lifesized version of historic downtown Davenport. Along the river's edge, at the bottom of each photo, McGreevy has placed architectural remnants which he has collected over the years of historic building parts: tin ceiling squares from the J. H. C. Petersen building, exterior tin cornicing from Ankeny Flats on W. 3rd St., support beams from the Stern's Building (Judy's Antiques), etc. The exhibit is a fascinating retrospective on a very rare panoramic photo, which has managed to capture all of what is no more!
