
Put a big red circle on your fall "old house" tour calendar for **Sept. 10, 7 P.M.** Scott County Historic Preservation Society members have been invited to



take a sunset tour of Davenport's finest example of Italian Revival Villa architecture---the **Renwick Mansion, 901 Tremont Avenue.** The Renwick is a *tour de force* among mansions with its castle-like exterior of rock faced limestone, with a massive iron crested tower jutting skyward above the tree tops. The mansion's interior is equally as jaw dropping, with 12-14 ft. high interior doors, three story walnut staircase, marble foyer, eight

incredible marble fireplaces, original wooden window shutters, period furnishings and a panoramic view from the tower which extends miles up, and down, the river valley.

The mansion was built on its four acre bluff top prominence in 1877 by lumber baron James Renwick, owner of the legendary Renwick Saw Mill. In 1907, the mansion became part of the St. Katharine's School
