St. Ambrose Alumni House

After the Civil War ended in 1865, America began to rebuild itself on several levels, this was the era of Reconstruction. Gorgeous buildings and homes sprung up across the country with architects that took their inspiration from across the Atlantic. From 1840 through 1890 the Italianate style swept through the Midwest in a frenzy. These homes were modeled after the villas in the Italian countryside with an eyecatching asymmetry.

Built in 1871, nearly fourteen decades in existence, the St. Ambrose Alumni House (F.H. Miller House), was the collaboration of builder John Drew and Davenport's first architect, Willett L. Carroll. The three-story brick building cost about \$25,000 to build. Its shape is similar to many area houses built during this time period

and in this (Italianate) style, but, according to architectural historian Martha Bowers, it was distinguished through its "variety of window shapes, unusual gambrel-roofed dormers and entrance porch of simple columns and curved brackets".
