

Join us as Architect John Gere leads a tour of the First Presbyterian Church. The church is located on the corner of Kirkwood Avenue and Iowa Streets in Davenport, Iowa.

The congregation was organized on May 5, 1838 but the present church was started on March 18, 1898 and was finished and dedicated on December 17, 1899.

This church was designed by Clausen & Burrows (who also designed St. John's United Methodist Church 3 years later). The church is Romanesque in style with some very beautiful stained glass windows.

SCHPS donated \$200.00 to Schuetzen Park towards the restoration of the streetcar station. Built in 1911, it is the only original structure that remains in the park.

SCHPS donated \$100.00 towards the restoration of the Forest Grove School. Built in 1873, the restoration group hopes to restore it to its 1940s appearance. It is one of a handful of original Scott County one-room school houses still standing.
