

Henning (Henry) J. Witt, born June 12, 1846 in Dithmarschen, Germany came to America at age 18.

After various business ventures, he formed a partnership with John Hill in 1870. Later he bought out the Miller Bottling works on West 2<sup>nd</sup> Street and named it H.J.Witt. He continued in this business until 1906 when he retired.

In 1875 he married Catharine Hinrichs in Davenport, and they had 5 children: Bertha, Johnny, Otto, Zella and Hertha. Mr. Witt held membership in the Elks, the Turner Society, Knights of Pythias, and the Schuetzen Society.

Two construction dates are listed for this house, 1890 and 1894. Dominating the corner of 6<sup>th</sup> and Gaines, this irregularly massed combination of tower, gables, and dormers is a very good example of Queen Anne style of architecture. Of special interest is the exterior with bands of shingles giving it textural diversity.

Mr. Witt died on April 6, 1910 and his widow lived in the house until 1919.

Maurice and Lois Woods purchased the house and completely restored this home. The Iowa Department of Cultural Affairs in September, 2013 awarded the Woods a certificate for historic preservation.
