Thursday, July 10, 2014 6:30 p.m. A SCHPS Picnic at Schuetzen Park

Schuetzen Park was a 23 acre amusement-style park created by German-Americans, primarily as a site to practice a form of target shooting that they brought with them from Germany. Several dozen "Schuetzen Parks" once existed across the U.S. for this purpose. From 1870-1923 the Davenport Schuetzen Park flourished and even survived the events of WWI and prohibition. However, as Davenport grew around the park, which was once considered "in the country," the Davenport Shooting Association sold the site to the Psychopathic-Chiropractic Sanitarium. The Sanitarium's interests eventually transferred to the Davenport Good Samaritan Center, which still occupies a small portion of the park's original grounds. The Schuetzen Park Gilde launched a community effort to re-consolidate and purchase the various parcels of park property that had been sold-off over the years since 1923, and in 2003 the park officially reopened to the public as a "Nature Park" deep in the heart of West Davenport. Gone are the shooting ranges, bowling alleys, roller coaster, beer hall, music pavilion and street car line, but the site which was loved by its creators for its natural beauty has been saved for future generations to enjoy. The last structure built on the site in 1911, the streetcar pavilion, still stands and is undergoing a multi-vear restoration process. The park also maintains significant archives of items closely related to the Park and the organizations associated with it. Future plans for the Park could include a small multi-use lodge structure.
