Scott County Historic Preservation Society, Inc.

Today's "House on the Hill," as this mansion is known, is one of the most intact historic homes in Rock Island. It was owned by one family for most of its life and, subsequently, by Augustana College, which has been a loving custodian for over fifty years. It has 25 rooms and was donated to Augustana College in the 1950s. The house is also called the Weyerhaeuser House, named for lumber baron Frederick Weyerhaeuser and his wife Sarah. He emigrated from Germany and, in 1856, arrived in this area, where he and his brother-in-law soon formed the Weyerhaeuser and Denkmann Lumber Company. This fine Second Empire style home was built for Frederick Weyerhaeuser, who with Frederick Denkmann, founded the lumber empire that still thrives today.


