Phase II of the restoration of the historic Schuetzen Park Streetcar pavilion began. The Park is located at 700 Waverly Road in west Davenport. Bi-State Masonry of Rock Island will repair ceiling support beams and resurface some of the structure's outside walls. The pavilion was built in 1911 with funds left to the Park by Davenport Brewer Heinrich Koehler. The Tri-City Railway company serviced the Schuetzen Park area with it's streetcars until the late 1930's. The pavilion, which is a City of Davenport Historic Landmark, is the only remaining original structure at Davenport Schuetzen Park Historic Site, The Riverboat Development Authority, The Roy E Murray Charitable Trust and private donations have made this phase of the project possible. Total cost of this project is approximately \$4,500. More info can be located on the Park's website: Schuetzen Park. We are lucky to use this for our annual picnic at the close of our year - July.
