
A Grand Hotel

The Butterworth Center and Christmas Party



The Butterworth Center was built by Charles Deere in 1892 as a wedding present for his daughter and new son-in-law, William Butterworth. The newlyweds named their home "Hillcrest," and eventually tripled the size of the residence.

The Butterworth's went on to install what was probably one of the largest residential organs in the Midwest. They also designed their library to hold a beautiful 18th century Italian ceiling painting, making it one of only six Venetian ceiling paintings known to exist in the United States.
