Ever wonder about the large beautiful mansions on S. Fairmount Street? On Thursday, May 10th at 6:30 Steve & Kelli Grubbs will welcome SCHPS members to their home at 324 Fairmount.

Built about 1865, it was the home of August F. Schmidt and adjoined the home of his brother, Fritz T. Schmidt. The Schmidt family came from Germany to Scott County in 1847.

In the 1860s the Schmidts were the first to cultivate vineyards in the area of what was called Blackhawk. Their success in growing grapes on the beautiful rolling hills prompted others in the area to take up grape growing. Fritz T. and two of his sons established a wholesale liquor business with vineyards and cellars at Blackhawk.

In 1897 they built their liquor store at 115 E. 3rd, the current Duck City building.

A unique feature of the Schmidt/Grubbs home is the wine cellar built between the homes of the brothers, August and Fritz.
