Hibernian Hall 421 Brady Street

Hibernian Hall was an Irish ethnic fraternal organization. The Irish started moving to Davenport after the Great Famine in Ireland of the 1840s and 1850s. In Davenport, the Irish were the second largest immigrant group, topped only by the Germans.

The building is located in the Downtown Commercial Historic District. It was built in 1891 by Struck and Jaeger. Frederich G. Clausen was the architect. It was in Romanesque revival style with vertical groupings of round arched windows. It has a gabled parapet with decorative pinnacles on top.





In 1886, the Sanborn fire insurance map shows the Christian Chapel on the site. It was two stories set back from Brady Street. It dates to about 1855. You can still see it at the back of the building.



The building directly to the north was the Philip Worley House built in 1860 for Dr. Worley. It is a two story, Greek revival brick building. It has an off-center front entrance, elongated first story windows, wood shutters, and a hipped porch roof. A one story attached building to the north served as an office.


For those looking for some exercise and a volunteer opportunity...
