## DeLescaille House 901 Mississippi Davenport, Iowa

November 11, 2021 @ 6:00 pm



This beautiful home is located in the Prospect Park District in east Davenport just west of the Village of East Davenport. This historic district was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1984.

Mrs. Hattie DeLescailles was the daughter of George S. Shaw, a native of Vermont

who came to Davenport in 1864 and was a building contractor, real estate developer and member of the lumber firm of Renwick, Shaw & Crossett. Hattie grew up in the neighborhood about a block away. The Shaw homestead was on E. 11th Street just west of Mississippi, Ave where Hattie married Jules DeLescaille, a Belgium born jeweler, in 1881. Shortly after Hattie's marriage, the Shaws & DeLescailles moved to Cloquet, Minnesota where George Shaw was the president of Cloquet Lumber Company and one of the best-known lumbermen in the northwest. Cloquet Lumber was founded by Shaw, along with Weyerhaueser & Denkman. George Shaw died in 1897 in Cloquet, Minnesota and the DeLescailles returned to Hattie's old Davenport neighborhood and built the house at 901 Mississippi where Hattie lived until her death in 1930. Her husband preceded her in death in 1902.

Built in 1898, the 2 1/2 story house is a Colonial Revival/Queen Anne style. It was designed by architect Gustav Hansson. It features a porte-cochère with a sunroom above, an expansive foyer with columns and oak leaf crowns, cove molding and wainscoting. There is leaded and stained glass throughout the house and hand painted Italian murals. The dining room is walnut paneled with a built-in china cabinet.

From the veranda, the corner tower, or the sunroom, there is an excellent view of the Mississippi River.
