1. **Call to Order: Chair Scheibe** called the meeting to order at 5:30 P.M.

Minutes: Consideration of April 5, 2022 meeting minutes. Rochau made a motion to approve.
Seconded by Armstrong. Vote: All Ayes (5-0)

Schnekloth arrived after the vote.

3. <u>Public Hearing – Lighting Ordinance:</u> Mathias provided a brief summary of the intent and text of the proposed lighting ordinance.

Chair Scheibe opened the public hearing. With no comments from the public, **Chair Scheibe** closed the public hearing.

Chair Scheibe welcomed the Commission to respond. With no comments from the Commission, **Chair Scheibe** welcomed a motion.

Piatak made a motion to recommend approval of the proposed lighting ordinance text to the Board of Supervisors. Seconded by Rochau. Vote: All Ayes (5-0)

Schnekloth arrived after the vote.

4. <u>Staff Presentation – Draft Ordinance, Utility-Scale Solar:</u> Mathias said staff wanted the Commission to begin to settle on ordinance text to regulate utility-scale solar installations in the County, and shared the basic framework of a draft ordinance to begin the discussion.

Commissioners posed a number of questions and requests for more information or further research, including the topics of landscape buffering, CSR2 maps, CSR2 thresholds, defining the sites/Area of Interest, setbacks, and how to encourage solar installations to locate within established city limits.

- 5. <u>Staff Presentation Ordinance Proposal, Conservation-Recreation:</u> Staff introduced the broad intent of a conservation-recreation zoning district, and the Commission agreed more staff time should be dedicated to the topic for further research and analysis.
- 6. <u>Amendment to Administrative Rules Section 2.0 (Regular Meeting Times):</u> The Commission held two votes on two elements of their administrative rules regarding meeting times. Prior to the meeting, the rules had the Commission meeting at 7:00 PM from October to April, and at 7:30 PM from April to October.

Schnekloth made a motion to amend Administrative Rules Section 2.0 to meet at the same time year round. Seconded by Piatak. Vote: All Ayes (6-0)

Armstrong made a motion to amend Administrative Rules Section 2.0 to meet at 5:30 PM. Seconded by Rochau. Vote: All Ayes (6-0)

7. <u>Adjournment:</u> With no further public comments and no other business to discuss, **Chair Scheibe** adjourned the meeting at 6:18 P.M.
