1. <u>Call to Order</u>: Chair Scheibe called the meeting to order at 5:30 P.M.

- 2. <u>Minutes:</u> Consideration of June 6, 2023 meeting minutes. Maxwell made a motion to approve. Seconded by Rochau. Vote: 4-0, All Ayes
- 3. Public Hearing, Ordinance Text Amendment: Chair Scheibe read a summary of the legal notice and asked staff to describe the proposal. Mathias explained the process of coming to a final ordinance on hazardous liquid pipelines, saying the County would be wise to adopt a streamlined, less cumbersome ordinance in order to withstand potential legal challenges. Mathias said the final proposal is limited to several setback requirements from certain zoning districts and land uses and a requirement for an emergency plan.

Chair Scheibe opened the public hearing.

Chair Scheibe asked whether the language in 6.6 W(4), referring to a "qualified engineer" was sufficiently specific. **Myron Scheibe (27015 Glynns Creek Court)** suggested the terminology be revised to "qualified *professional* engineer."

Maxwell proposed that the language in 6.6 W.1(A) be revised from "... shall be required from dwellings" to "...shall be required from *all* dwellings."

Maxwell raised the idea of requiring setbacks from livestock facilities. **Paustian** said he had concerns about grazing areas for livestock saying setbacks from those would be ideal, but admittedly hard to enforce. **Paustian** said he supported setbacks from buildings that house livestock. **Maxwell** asked what threshold in terms of Animal Unit Capacity (AUC) would be appropriate for affected livestock buildings. **Silas** suggested that any facility subject to the Master Matrix review would be a straight-forward threshold for AUC.

Chair Scheibe closed the public hearing and asked for staff's recommendation.

Mathias said staff recommended approval of the ordinance text amendment as proposed, including the three (3) revisions/additions suggested by the Commission:

- 1. Add: 6-6.W.1(A) "...shall be required from <u>all</u> dwellings..."
- 2. Add: 6-6.W.1(A) "...houses of worship, auditoriums, and livestock facilities that are considered by the Iowa Department of Natural Resources to be Confined Animal Feeding Operations subject to Master Matrix review."
 - 3. Add: 6-6.W.4 "...prepared by a qualified professional engineer..."

Chair Scheibe welcomed the Commission to respond.

Piatak made a motion to recommend approval of the ordinance text amendment in accordance with staff's recommendation. Seconded by Maxwell. Vote: 4-0, All Ayes

4. **Adjournment:** With no further business to discuss, **Chair Scheibe** adjourned the meeting at 6:02 P.M.
